Healthcare Assistants Training



A need was identified for trained people to administer medical care more than traditional, "aayas". Varosha with our partner HVR in Kolkata began a 6-month training program which taught hygiene, how to take blood pressure, pulse and temperature, first aid, administering medications, pregnancy care, new born care, special care for low birth weight and preterm babies, basic physiotherapy and rehabilitation.

A pilot program was launched in July 2015 by placing an advertisement in Bartaman Patrika for interested candidates. After screening and registration procedures, the students were taught by Dr. Ena Poddar, Dr. Arup Chakrabartty, Dr. **Swagat** Bhattacharya and professional nurses from 6th September to 6th December. Physiotherapy classes were taught by Mr. Somun Talukder and Mr. Raja Bose in November. The students began practical training from December 2015 to the end of February 2016 in the New Avenue Nursing Home, New Town and other private medical centers. After successful competition of the pilot program the students quickly found jobs in homes or medical clinics.



We were very encouraged by the success of the pilot program and have begun a second round of training classes in June 2016. This session we have 15 female students and 3 men (who, once trained will be able to assist physiotherapists in male hospital wards). Currently the theory classes are underway.

The pilot program and the second round of training were entirely funded by a generous donation from Dr. Adrija Das and Dr. Amitava Das. We thank them for helping train the students and giving them an opportunity to have a rewarding job and financial security. We are planning to continue this training as long as we can identify students who are interested and committed.

Children's Centers - Dipto Alo



The Children's Academies in Kulti and New Alipore and the theater, dancing and graphic arts center in New Alipore, Jibon Alo, hold a very special place in our hearts. We are grateful to the caring teachers who have helped the students in Dipto Alo as we start our fourth year, teaching the children English, practical math skills and basic computer skills. Last year we had 92% retention of students and they were able to meet the assigned benchmarks of progress. We are able to provide a nurturing environment after school for them to learn, grow and interact. This project was initiated by a grant from Dr. Prodyot K. Day, in memory of his son, Pradipta.

In 2014, we started this project in the Khulna district of Sundarban. Initially ten families were selected to be trained and supported in fish farming. A demonstration pond was set up and populate with fish. After six months, the fish were harvested and sold.

Many of the families had backyard ponds where they could carry out aquaculture themselves. The families had other livestock (goats) and ducks on their property and they sold eggs or meat. All the families were given seeds and fertilizers and taught how to grow different vegetables and rotate their crops. At the end of one year, these families became self-sufficient.

We have started the same project with 18 new families. Varosha is supporting their small family farms as they grow vegetables, and raise hybrid hen, ducks, and goats by providing seeds, plants and feed and also through the support of an onsite coordinator.









Tailoring Projects



We are pleased that several of our projects have reached maturity and we are at the stage where we can hand over responsibilities to the trained beneficiaries.

The centers under the Sonar Alo banner, after six years of training women in needlework, machine embroidery, tailoring, fabric painting and printing have reached maturity. In phone conversations our beneficiaries indicated that they are earning between Rs. 2000 and 4000 per month. During the last few years we were able to bring the works of our beneficiaries for display during Mahalaya celebrations in Chicago. In the second half of 2016, we will be exiting from these projects after giving sufficient time and resources for our beneficiaries to transition successfully.

The tailoring programs under Puber Alo in Goragacha, New Alipore and Kulti and Jorir Alo in Thakurpukur are continuing successfully.
